7. Define treatment resistant OCD. What are the factors responsible for refractoriness to first line treatment of OCD? Discuss management of resistant OCD. 2+3+5
8. What are the essential features of PTSD diagnosis? Write about clinical features and treatment of PTSD. 3+(3+4)
9. What are common side effects of lithium therapy? How is lithium toxicity diagnosed? How do you manage lithium toxicity? 2+3+5
10. What are the most common extrapyramidal side effects of First Generation Anti-psychotics? Name the rating scales used to measure their severity. Briefly write about their management. 2+2+6
