 - d) Complications of splenectomy

2. A 25 year lady having bilateral prominent eyes with a diffuse swelling in midline of neck which moves on deglutition. 3+3+4
 - a) Discuss differential diagnosis of this case.
 - b) Suggest investigations for diagnosing the case.
 - c) What treatment options are available?

3. A 60 year old diabetic patient has non-healing ulcer on dorsum of right foot. 4+6
 - a) Discuss pathogenesis of non-healing of ulcer.
 - b) How will you treat him?

4. A 30 year young male has difficulty in urination. The urinary stream is weak and improves on exertion. There is past history of pus discharge per urethra 1½ years ago. 3+2+5
 - a) What is the etiopathogenesis of the case?
 - b) What investigations are required to be done for him?
 - c) What is the complete treatment?

5. A 56 year old male has difficulty in swallowing food for last 6 month which is progressively worsening. He gives history of significant loss of weight. 3+(2+5)
 - a) Discuss the differential diagnosis.
 - b) Discuss investigations and various treatment options.

6. A 60 year old male has sustained fracture neck femur. 2+8
 - a) What is the first aid treatment?
 - b) Discuss various treatment options.
