 - a) Discuss the cause, history and clinical features of lateral epicondylitis.
 - b) How will you manage this patient?
 - c) Write briefly on the causes and management of aches and pains in a patient like him.

 - a) List the causes of neck pain that you would consider.
 - b) What history and clinical signs would you elicit?
 - c) You elicit severe tenderness of the cervical vertebrae. How will you manage this patient?

 - a) Allergic rhinitis
 - b) Sinusitis
 - c) Foreign body in the nose
 - d) CSF rhinorrhea
 - e) How will you manage moderate to severe allergic rhinitis in this child?
